GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL

All children are ready to benefit from a quality kindergarten experience when they are five years old by September 1 of that school year. But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.

NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP



Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) helps transform the lives of first-time mothers and their babies.

Through ongoing home visits from registered nurses, moms receive the care and support they need to have a healthy pregnancy, provide responsible and competent care for their children, and become more economically self-sufficient. From pregnancy until the child turns two years old, Nurse-Family Partnership Nurse Home Visitors form a much-needed, trusting relationship with their clients, instilling confidence and empowering them to achieve a better life for their children – and themselves.

AMERICORPS

First Steps AmeriCorps provides part- and full-time service opportunities with Local Partnerships across South Carolina. Participating Local Partnerships, or AmeriCorps Service Sites, are selected through applications submitted as part of South Carolina First Steps' grantmaking process. There were 3 member roles during the 2020-21 program year: Community Education and Outreach, Family Support, and Parent Educator. AmeriCorps member activities ranged from providing one-on-one support for families using the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) International curriculum to hosting events about school readiness and local early childhood services.

IMAGINATION LIBRARY



As the local affiliate of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, we provide free, high-quality books to children from birth until age five, no matter their family's income.

Children enrolled in our Imagination Library program receive one book per month by mail. Each title is selected by a panel of early childhood literacy experts, who are responsible for choosing books that meet the age-specific developmental needs of young children.


CHILD CARE QUALITY ENHANCEMENT



Many private child care centers strive to provide high quality care but lack the resources often available to publicly-funded early childhood programs. Our Child Care Quality Enhancement (QE) program aims to produce measurable improvements in the quality of care provided to young children.

CHILD CARE TRAINING



High-quality child care hinges on high-quality professional development that meets the needs of the local child care workforce. Our training programs are certified through SC Endeavors and include topics in the areas of nutrition, health and safety, curriculum, child guidance, professional development and program administration. Our 2020-2021 trainings included:

Workshop topics included using themes in the classrooms, social-emotional skills, classroom arrangement, stress management, developmental milestones, using redirection to reinforce limits, fine and gross motor skills, meal-time success, building and maintaining relationships, bloodborne pathogens, and engaging in continuous quality improvement.

CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIPS



For many families in Edgefield County, the cost of quality child care is out of reach.

Our scholarship program makes payments to child care providers to care

for children from families who have risk factors that

might impact their child's success in school.

The children in this program receive developmental screenings and are enrolled in our Imagination Library program.

The parents of our scholarship children also attend classes through our Nurturing Parenting program.



FOUR-YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN



South Carolina First Steps provides eligible children with free enrollment in full-day four-year-old kindergarten. In coordination with First Steps local partnerships and more than 230 private, community and faith-based preschool providers, First Steps 4K expands access to quality early education across the state.



ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for enrollment, a child must be:



4 years old on or before September 1



Eligible for Medicaid, SNAP or TANF, experiencing homelessness or transiency, or in foster care

PREPARING FOR STATEWIDE EXPANSION

With First Steps 4K, families are in the driver's seat. They choose the program that best meets their needs. Families can enroll their child in any of the 244 private, nonprofit, or faith-based child care centers or schools participating in the program. The majority of First Steps 4K providers offer 8-hour day and year-round instruction, including summers, which is at no cost to parents.





NURTURING PARENTING PROGRAM



The Edgefield County First Steps Nurturing Parenting Strategy is designed to empower individuals and families with new knowledge, beliefs, strategies, and skills to make good and healthy lifestyle choices through group -based parenting sessions.

Our child care scholarship families are referred to this program and we receive referrals from community partners such as the Edgefield County Department of Social Services and the local physicians' offices.

FAMILY LITERACY



Family literacy programs offer an integrated and family-friendly approach, helping both parents and children improve their literacy skills. Family literacy services integrate all the following: adult education, early childhood education, parent education, and interactive parent/child activities.

Our family literacy program helps parents of young children increase their education levels; teaches parents how to support their child's literacy and overall development; and provides quality early learning experiences for children 0-5 while their parents attend adult education.


